



MSc in Endodontics

Background

Endodontics is one of the most technically challenging aspects of general dental practice. The demand for endodontic care is set to grow due to increasing life expectancy combined with greater awareness amongst the general public that diseased teeth can often be saved rather than extracted.

Despite this, most general practitioners are unable to use the new techniques that have developed dramatically during the last 20 years, and lack the knowledge and skills to offer their patients appropriate endodontic care.

Overview

The MSc in Endodontics focuses on developing general dental practitioners' knowledge and skills for the practice of endodontic care. The programme is delivered by leading professionals, academics and researchers in the field of endodontic dentistry, and supported by respected academics from the field of continuing professional development.

Duration

The period of study for the MSc will normally be a minimum of three years and a maximum of five years part-time.

Entry requirements

Candidates must be registered with the GDC and have full professional indemnity. Overseas candidates should be registered with the appropriate regulatory body in the country of practice.

Course structure

The MSc in Endodontics is a modular programme involving taught days, self-directed learning and clinical practice. It is assessed by coursework, essays, examinations and either a dissertation or project.

Year 1

- Principles of Endodontics

Year 2

- Surgical Endodontics
- Clinical Practice in Endodontics

Year 3

Either

- Professional Project

Plus one of the following modules:

- Clinical Quality Improvement and Risk Management in Endodontics
- Introduction to Management in Health Service Organisations

Or

- Dissertation
